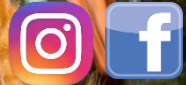

Pet Camping  
**SAFETY TIPS**



Summer months are the perfect weather for relaxing camping trips with your fur-babies. Although it may seem like a good idea to bring your pets, always keep in mind the following tips to prepare for any unexpected issues that may occur.

1. **Pet First Aid Kit** — Most remote campsites will not have quick access to veterinary care. For helpful hints/ideas visit <http://www.aspcapro.org/resource/saving-lives/how-make-pet-first-aid-kit>
2. **Locate the nearest animal emergency clinic** — Be sure to save it to your phone contacts.
3. **Pet proof your campsite** — Keep in mind that the previous campers may not have pets on their mind when cleaning up. Always inspect the campsite to pick up anything your pet may get into.
4. **Keep your pet on leash** — Do not allow your pet to roam. He/she is in an unfamiliar area and without realizing your pet could venture off.
5. **Proper ID** — keep your pet's proper ID on his/her collar always. A reflective collar may be something to consider if your pet will be out on the campsite at night.



# TIPS FOR PET-SAFE Celebrations



- 🐾 **BBQ table scraps are not good for pets! Keep an eye out for cooked bones, corn cobs, grapes and onions. All the following pose hazards ranging from an upset stomach to a medical emergency!**
- 🐾 **The weather can cause heat stroke. Always provide cold water and shade for dogs to cool down.**
- 🐾 **Fireworks can cause anxiety to pets. Make sure to keep pets inside and dispose of any firework materials, they contain poisonous chemicals.**

## Tick Awareness

Ticks are parasites that feed on the blood of animals and humans. Even though they are small and may seem harmless, ticks can transmit many diseases through their bite. They are most active in late spring and summer and live in tall brush or grass. Most ticks are visible to the naked eye but some, like the deer tick, are very small and are hard to detect until they start feeding. One of the disease that ticks can carry is Lyme disease. Lyme disease is a bacterial infection that affect humans, dogs and other mammals. It is primarily carried by the black legged tick or better known as the deer tick. Typically, after a human is bitten by a tick carrying the disease a skin rash will appear almost like a “bull’s-eye”. Other clinical signs of Lyme disease include depression, swelling of the lymph nodes, loss of appetite, fever, swollen, painful joints and kidney failure. If you or your pet has been bitten by a tick, it is important to carefully remove it and seek medication attention as soon as possible. Any contact with the tick’s blood can potentially transmit infection to your pet or you. Here at All Creatures, we provide multiple products that prevent ticks.
